The project

The **PROMA** project (2020-1-RO01-KA204-080214) focused on adult education with the aim to foster **the integration of Roma women** in their local communities through education.

PROMA was implemented in four countries with dense Roma populations (Romania, Spain, Greece, North Macedonia) and involved two different groups of participants,

- **Roma women**
- **formal & non-formal education specialists working with Roma women.**

Activities

Identifying pathways to integration (needs' assessment).

Development of the capacity building programme for formal and non-formal educators working with Roma women.

Pilot delivery of the capacity building programme for formal and non-formal educators supporting Roma women.

Design and implementation of pilot programmes aiming at the integration of Roma women at local level.

Organisation of 3 open days (in Spain, Greece & North Macedonia), and an international conference (in Romania) .
