

Project Progress

UPDATES ON MAJOR MILESTONES ACHIEVED

1. Progress Report

The comprehensive progress report contained a detailed information about the tasks and activities which were implemented by the partner institutions in Greece, Germany, Georgia and Ukraine in the frames of Re-Direction project. The progress report covered each major step undertaken by the project team, ranging from methodological framework and skills mismatches to development of inclusive guide and dissemination and exploitation activities related to different stages of the project implementation. 2. Consultation Scheme Report

The Re-Direction project partners undertook a large-scale consultation to validate the course materials. This validation process was conducted via a structured questionnaire, gathering responses from a broad spectrum of stakeholders. The project team implemented a structured consultation process to validate the training content. A total of **156 stakeholders** participated in this process. The respondents' group included **50 policymakers, 54 academic staff and 52 other stakeholders**. The report was completed and approved in June 2025.

3. Creation of MOOC Elearning Platform

One of the most remarkable achievements of the Re-Direction partner organizations of the year 2025 was the creation of [MOOC Elearning Platform](#). **With the engagement of each partner institution, particularly the universities**, from Ukraine, Georgia, Greece and Germany, the consortium has developed courses in English, Georgian and Ukrainian. Some courses are suitable for students with a variety of academic backgrounds and do not require specific prior knowledge. Others are specialization courses aimed at students from specific disciplines.

4. Mid Term External Evaluation Report

The external evaluation report also has to be highlighted as one of the important aspects for the Re-Direction project in 2025. According to the report, prepared by an independent external evaluator, the project tasks and activities have been executed in a positive way by the partners which creates the prospects for the achievement of the main goals set by the Re-Direction team for future. The report indicated high relevance of the project for the current circumstances taking place in Ukraine and Georgia as well as emphasized the long-term influence of the project for the field of education in both countries. It also made a positive emphasis on effective, efficient and sustainable nature of the project.


SUMMARIES OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

On March 20-21, the Re-Direction project partners had a very interesting and inspirational transnational meeting in Karlsruhe. The partners discussed the materials and administrative-technical aspects of specific and generic courses of MOOC Elearning Platform as well as dissemination and exploitation activities and future steps which they have to undertake in the frames of the project. This meeting brought together **16 partners**, including the representatives of Ministries of Education and Science of Georgia and Ukraine.

On October 6-7, the Re-Direction Staff Training was conducted at Ilia State University in Tbilisi. Bringing together **more than 30 attendees**, both onsite and online, the event discussed inclusivity principles and stakeholder engagement in higher education. Participants explored Elearning on Inclusivity and attended a session on the Operational Arrangements of Piloting, co-led by Karls and Metropolitan College. The event was continued by the workshops on ICT skills, Sustainability, and Elearning course development.

On September 18, Georgian partners of the Re-Direction project held a workshop with the stakeholders about the update of curricula. **36 stakeholders** of various background, including policymakers, academic staff, representatives of NGO and enterprise sectors and other relevant experts, engaged actively in the meeting. The event received the **95% positive feedback** from the participants.

On March 28, International scientific and practical conference was organized by O. M. Beketov National University of Urban Economy in Kharkiv, under name “Topical Issues of the Economy: Global Trends and Modern Challenges”, in the frames of Re-Direction project. With the **89% positive feedback** result, the event gathered **83 participants** of various educational and scientific fields from the countries like Germany, Georgia, Vietnam, Turkey, Bulgaria, Ukraine, etc.
